The relevant facts in this case are identical to those in Kendall v. United States Automobile Ass'n, [Ms. 1061472, May 15, 2009] \_\_\_\_ So. 3d \_\_\_\_ (Ala. 2009), in which our supreme court held that, when a driver is injured in an accident in which a government entity is at fault, a driver's underinsured-motorist insurance carrier is not obligated to pay any amount of damages over the statutory maximum for which a government entity is legally liable, § 11-93-2, Ala. Code 1975, even though the evidence is undisputed that the damages incurred by the driver exceeded that statutory maximum. Because the relevant facts are identical, I agree that Kendall is dispositive of this case. However, I also agree with Chief Justice Cobb's special concurrence in Kendall. It is the job of the Alabama Legislature, not of the appellate courts, to revisit the uninsured/underinsured motorists statute, § 32-7-23, Ala. Code 1975, to clarify whether it intended outcomes such as the one in the present case.
